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Pollution Prevention

- Reducing the release of pollutants into the environment.
- May be achieved by reducing the amount of material used, reusing materials or by recycling materials.
- Also includes the selection of alternate materials that are less harmful to the environment.



In Construction

- Sediment and nutrient laden runoff is major pollutant released from site.
- Oil and grease from vehicles and other equipment and fuel from on-site fueling.
- Runoff from asphalt storage and areas.
- Paints, sealants and other construction chemicals.
- Detergents



Other Pollutants

- Dust from disturbed soil.
- Cement dust, abrasives and paint spray.
- Ashes, fumes and grit from on-site burning.
- Solid materials from construction debris.
- Chemical spills.
- Discharges from on-site sewage treatment.

Used Oil Collection Facility

1. PETROLEUM BASED OILS ONLY.
2. OIL MUST BE UNCONTAMINATED. IT CANNOT CONTAIN SOLVENTS, CHEMICALS, PAINT, ETC.
3. LIMIT OF 5 GALLONS PER WEEK PER INDIVIDUAL.
4. DRIVERS LICENSE MUST BE PROVIDED.
